Greetings from the Dean... Dear Colleagues,

We got the year off to a great start at Church in the Highlands. It was great to see so many old—er, long-time—friends, and to meet some new members. Thanks to Bob Chase for hosting us, and for arranging for our magical entertainment—especially the last minute change necessitated by the illness of Li Lin, who was originally scheduled to perform Acrobatics and Sichuan Changing Faces. Thanks, too, to Frank Miller for spending the afternoon cooking for us, and to all who brought side dishes or beverages.

Many of you will be reading this before the Bronxville Organ Crawl on Sunday, October 28. This looks to be a delightful afternoon, and Accuweather's long-range forecast says there will be no October snow storm this year! I hope to see many of you there.

Our next meeting will be held at St. Peter's Episcopal, Peekskill, Monday, Nov. 12, when Dan Clayton of Clayton Acoustics Group will speak on acoustics in worship spaces. You may have met Dan at National and Regional conventions. He's an engaging speaker, and the topic is an important one. I can think of only one thing organists like to gripe about more than acoustics—but it's a lot easier to solve the acoustical problems. It's a topic important also for clergy and non-musical lay leaders (e.g., building committee members) so please feel free to invite them. Also, we'll have quite a collection of gently-used music you're welcome to help yourself to. I have a big pile the chapter inherited, but couldn't bring it to the last meeting. I had to make a fast getaway to catch a flight to Oklahoma City (for the day job) and didn't want to stick someone else with the task of packing it up and lugging it home. Another reason to come to THIS meeting.

The scheduling is a bit of an experiment. For the past many years, almost all our events have been on Sunday afternoons, - the time that drew the most members. However, we do have members with Sunday afternoon services who can't attend a chapter event without going to the expense and hassle of getting a substitute, so we're trying this on a Monday night. Monday seems to have the least conflict with worship and community choir rehearsals, so we hope most of you who come regularly on Sunday can come this Monday night. But we make a special appeal to those who can't easily come on Sundays to join us for this session. Last year, we tried a session on a Saturday morning; attendance was light. We'll see if Monday night works better. There's no day and time that works for everyone, but we want to serve all our members as best we can. Your attendance will tell us if holding programs on other days of the week is a good idea.

Speaking of good ideas...if you have any (about meeting schedules or anything else), please e-mail them to me or call me and let us know how we can help you.

And if you have not been to a chapter meeting in a long time—or maybe you've never been to one—pease do join us at one of upcoming events. There are no strangers at these meetings; only friends you haven't met. Kevin Walsh
