The young American organist Christopher Houlihan has been labeled "gifted" (New York Times), "dazzling" (Wall Street Journal), and "one of the brightest stars in the new generation of American organists" (Cincinnati Enquirer). His "Vierne2012" tour attracted international attention and critical acclaim for performing the six organ symphonies of Louis Vierne in marathon concerts in six major North American cities. He has been a featured performer at two conventions of the American Guild of Organists and is scheduled for two more in 2013.

A graduate of Trinity College in Connecticut, Christopher Houlihan studied with John Rose, his organ teacher from the age of twelve. He earned his master's degree at The Juilliard School under Paul Jacobs. He earned the "Prix de Perfectionnement" from the French National Regional Conservatory in Versailles, and was assistant musician at the American Cathedral in Paris, performing for then President and First Lady of the U.S. Mr. and Mrs. George W. Bush.

Regions I and II Convention Update by Jason Charneski, Convention Coordinator

We are but a few months away from welcoming colleague organists, choir directors, students, and guests to Hartford for the 2013 AGO Regions I and II Convention.

The convention steering committee, with the guidance of regional councilors Cheryl Duerr and Agnes Armstrong, is pulling all things together: items such as the final convention schedule (and, as we know, there always can be last-minute changes), hospitality arrangements, logistical arrangements (especially with venues and transportation), arranging for exhibits, getting materials ready for publication in the program book, coordinating the regional Quimby competitions, keeping track of hotel reservations and overall convention registrations, securing volunteers to help make things run as smoothly as possible, and raising the funds necessary to make it all happen!

Complete details are available on the convention's website: www.hartfordago2013.org; but, I want to whet your appetite for the first moments we gather, on Sunday, June 30. We begin at the convention hotel, the Ramada Plaza Hartford Downtown, with the registration, hospitality desks and exhibits open. This is a great way to become acquainted with the hotel, convention personnel, exhibitors, and fellow conventioneers. Those who have purchased the transportation package will board buses at 4:30 for St. James's Episcopal Church in the center of bustling West Hartford in anticipation of the Bach Vespers at 5:00 p.m. Rick Erickson, director of the Bach Vespers (based at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, NYC), has indicated to me a program that will focus on the Feast of Pentecost, utilizing the Bach motet, "Der Geist hilft..." as the centerpiece. Model services such as this afford conventioneers opportunity to learn and to consider what they might do in their own professional work. Following the Bach Vespers (6:00 p.m.) all are welcome to explore on foot the center of West Hartford, which has restaurants and shops too numerous to number. At 8:10 p.m., buses for those in West Hartford center will transport them to St. John's Episcopal Church (similarly, buses will leave the hotel at 8:15 p.m. for St. John's – for those conventioneers who cannot get to the hotel in time for the Bach Vespers buses) for the convention's opening concert, an 8:30 p.m. recital by Isabelle Demers. Following Ms. Demers's concert at St. John's, buses will transport conventioneers back to the hotel, for a festive opening reception in the ballroom. Great music, food, and fellowship all on the first day of the convention; and, think, three more days of inspiration to come! If you've not registered already, please do so by going to www.hartfordago2013.org and clicking on the "Register Now" button!

Beyond being at the convention in person, there are two opportunities for you to make a lasting impression on the convention and the Guild: the first is an outright contribution to the convention. Your assistance in this area will help us to meet expenses. Any income exceeding expenses will assist the Guild (at the chapter, regional, and national levels) in future programs and initiatives. International Organ Competition and Academy

22-30 September, 2013

The Westfield Center Keyboard Competition and Academy offers young keyboard players the opportunity to explore the music of the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries through the avenue of instruments, sources and performance practices familiar to the composer. In 2011, Westfield held the first-ever North American international competition in fortepiano (at Cornell University), and in 2012 a competition in harpsichord (at the Smithsonian Institution). The 2013 Organ Competition, at Cornell and the Eastman School of Music, invites organists from around the world to perform on 3 landmark historic, and historically-informed instruments, before an international jury and for significant prizes. Under the rubric "Cosmopolitan Encounters" the focus is on the 18th century but moves far beyond.

The Competition (September 22-29) will run alongside the academy (September 24-30), as well as the annual EROI festival (September 26-29). Competition participants eliminated after the first round will be invited to join the Academy and festival. Deadline for applications is May 1, 2013. Please encourage your students, colleagues and friends to participate. We look forward to seeing you in upstate New York next September.
