Greetings from the Dean... I have spent quite a bit of time over the last couple of months working with National on their new program for collecting dues. As one of 7 chapters participating in the pilot program, getting everything set up has been both fun and challenging, but we are about to reap the benefits.

If you are a Regular, Special, Student or Chapter Friend member of the Westchester County chapter, you should have received an invoice from National, , either by e-mail (if they have an e-mail address) or snail mail. This invoice will cover chapter and every chapter in which you have dual membership (even if that chapter is not participating in the online pilot). You may renew online with a credit card, or you may print an invoice send a check (maybe your church's!) to National. Even if you renew by check, you may still update your data online, and we encourage you to do so—especially if you're handwriting is like mine!

Because Fairfield West is also participating in this pilot, if you are a Dual Member of Westchester and your primary chapter is Fairfield West, you will also be able to renew online.

Please note that there are two separate menu choices you should pay attention to. One is renew Dues and Subscriptions, which is where you will go to renew. The other is Update Personal Information. This is where you would update address, phone number, e-mail, positions, and other info for the directory and for our information. We ask that you please review this info when you renew (I pasted in a lot of missing info from the latest spreadsheet Douglas Kostner gave me), and then update it whenever you need to.

We are looking for your feedback on this system. Please send any comments, complaints, compliments and suggestions to me (dean@agowestchester.org). This will ensure that what is rolled out to the entire Guild will be the best system we can possibly have.

If you are a Dual or Dual Student member of Westchester and your primary chapter is NOT Fairfield West, National will NOT be able to collect your dues this year. For one more year you will receive a renewal form from our chapter in the mail, as in past years, and you will send that form back to us. In addition, your primary chapter will send you their form and you must separately renew with them. Wait till next year!

A quick final thought: Our first meeting in the fall is shaping up to be a dinner meeting on Sunday, September 22. Save the date!

Part time Organist /Minister of Music

The Minister of Music provides leadership that is second only to the Pastor in developing the worship services of the Church. Duties and Responsibilities

Work with the Pastor to plan, coordinate and review the music of all services and special events at the Church as it relates to the Church calendar, seasonal themes, special themes, sermon topic or other considerations.

Select and prepare all congregational, choral and instrumental music used at all Sunday services, Holy week, Easter, Christmas and other worship services, with special attention to the spiritual encouragement and enhancement of congregants.

Provide good communication, care, musical and Christian leadership to all choir members building a strong sense of community and teamwork and encourage active participation Church life.

Play at weddings, funerals and other special services as directed by the Pastor. The Minister of Music will be compensated for Weddings and funerals in addition to his/her regular salary in accordance with Church wedding and funeral policies.

Responsible for setting and staying within annual budget guidelines as approved by the Music Committee, Diaconate and Trustees.

Recruit and mentor volunteer singers and other musicians for all the worship services Lead regularly scheduled rehearsals, publish and disseminate rehearsal schedule and notify choir members of schedule changes in advance of any changes or cancellations.

Be responsible for the care and maintenance of choir robes.

Be responsible for organ and piano maintenance.

Select music at least two weeks in advance of regular Sundays and two months in advance of Holy Week and Christmas Choral Music Program.

Music selections should be provided to the Church by Tuesday morning each week. Bulletins should be proofed and returned to the Church Secretary no later than Wed in order to ensure printing can take place on Thursday of each week.

Manage the maintenance and organization of the Music Library.

Communicate all pertinent matters to the Music Committee for disclosure through monthly written reports to the Pastor and Diaconate on an ongoing basis.

Maintain a practice regimen to enhance his/her vocal and instrumental skills.

Professional Requirements: 3+ years in accompanying and choral direction in a Christian Church

Accountability: The Minister of Music is responsible to the Music Committee and to the Pastor. An annual evaluation is performed by the Music Committee in consultation with the Senior Minister.

Leave Time: Four Sundays with compensation for vacation during the year. Duties and Responsibilities

a) Select and prepare all congregational, choral and instrumental music used at all Sunday services,

Holy week, Easter, Christmas and other worship services, with special attention to the encouragement and enhancement of full and active participation by the assembly.

b) Play at weddings, funerals and other special services as directed by the Rector. The music minister will be compensated for Weddings and funerals in addition to his/her regular salary accordance with Parish wedding and funeral policies.

c) Select and prepare choral and instrumental music for special music programs in consultation with the Rector.

d) Recruit and mentor volunteer singers and other musicians for all the worship services including the contemporary service; and with the approval of the Rector and as provided for in the annual budget recruit, and supervise paid instrumentalists for Easter and Christmas as well as instrumentalists, accompanists and singers as needed. In addition maintain roster of contact information for all musicians and choir members.

e) Lead regularly scheduled rehearsals, publish and disseminate rehearsal schedule and notify choir members of schedule changes in advance of any changes or cancellations.

f) Meet with the Rector bi-weekly to plan, coordinate and review the music of all services and special events at Church of the Good Shepherd so as to continually enhance the way in which the musical needs of the parish are being met.

g) Select music two weeks in advance of regular Sundays and one month in advance of Holy Week and Christmas week. Music selections should be provided to the Parish administrator with clear and complete instructions on useage by Tuesday morning each week. Bulletins should be proofed and returned to the Parish Administrator no later than Wed in order to ensure printing can take place on Thursday of each week.

h) Ensure the Church's musical instruments are properly maintained and repaired, and provide recommendations for improvements and changes to these instruments as needed.

i) Provide pastoral guidance, care, musical and Christian formation to musicians building a strong sense of community and teamwork and encourage active participation in all aspects of Parish life.

2) To develop the Parish Music Ministry, the Music minister will:

a) Research, select and order new music that will enhance and broaden Church of the Good Shepherd's musical repertoire and enhance congregational participation.

b) Manage the development, maintenance and organization of the Parish Music Library.

c) Obtain, maintain and manage all copyright permissions that may be required as well as prepare and submit usage reports.

d) Maintain a practice regimen to enhance his/her vocal and instrumental skills.

General Policies

1) Office - The Minister of Music will be provided facilities for his/her work, including choir rehearsal space, access to a computer, copier and organ and piano that are in good repair.

2) Hours of Work - The Minister of Music's position is part-time (12 hours per week). He/she will meet and work with other staff members during regular business hours (9:00 a.m. -1:00p.m. M-Th) at least 1 day a week, taking into account his/her evening and weekend rehearsal and performance commitments at Church of the Good Shepherd. There will be no choir rehearsals during the summer.

3) Office Help - The Minister of Music will have the support services of church staff.
