Greetings from the Dean... Dear Colleagues,

For many of us, this is the start of a new year. While the Christian liturgical year begins on the first Sunday of Advent, most of our music programs begin after Labor Day. Jewish people begin Rosh Hashanah celebrations the evening of September 4. Many colleges began their fall terms in late August, while most elementary and high schools around here start right after Labor Day. And, of course, our program year begins in September-we have much to look forward to!

When the Board was putting together this year's program, we looked at what we've done in the past, and what we haven't done. Our opening dinner meeting and the Twelfth Night party are deservedly popular. The Paul Jacobs recital (which we're co-sponsoring with Hitchcock Presbyterian) is an opportunity to hear one of the finest organists. It's certainly not the first time we've presented a major artist and, while it may not be an annual event, I don't think it will be the last time. We'll gain new insights on Bach, while hearing the newest organ in the county. We'll have a chance to work on sight singing with our choir members—what a golden opportunity for choir directors! We'll have a chance to share spirituals, both organ and choral. We had a session a couple of years ago where we shared some ethnic favorites; it was one of our better sessions. And we're working on an organ crawl in the New Rochelle area—a follow-up to last year's very successful Bronxville crawl. (One thing you won't see on the program is a members recital. The last couple of years, we've had to do some serious arm twisting to get people to play, so we thought we'd give this a rest.)

Looking at this on paper, I'd say we have a wonderful year ahead of us, with some great music, great instruments, great practical skills and the conviviality that follows us wherever we go. But it's really up to you, because in order to get the benefits these sessions offer, you have to come. If you've never been to one of our meetings, you'll find a warm welcome.

A gentle reminder to those who have not yet renewed: please do so as quickly as possible. This will ensure that there is no break in your subscription to The American Organist. Dual Members whose primary chapter is NOT Fairfield West got their renewal in the US Mail in July. Everyone else should have received a notice from National, either an e-mail from renewals@agohq.org (if we have your e-mail address) or by snail mail. If you need assistance, please let me know.

I look forward to seeing you at the Church in the Highlands on the 29th. There will be a table of gently-used music that's free for the taking. How's that for a good way to start the year?

Newest listings appear first. Listings carried more than one month will be arranged chronologically by the month they were first run. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping *The Trompette* accurate and up-to-date.
