Greetings from the Dean ...... Dear Colleagues,

As I write this, there's a Stan Rodgers song playing in the background. It's got a great chorus, which I think most of us can relate to:

At last I'm ready for Christmas, I've even finished the tree; At last I'm ready for Christmas, like I thought I'd never be! With my feet propped up by a good hot fire and a matching inside glow; At last I'm ready for Christmas, with nearly two hours to go!

Of course, we don't prop our feet till after our Christmas services are ended...and we kick up our heels at the Chapter's annual Twelfth Night Party. Details are elsewhere in this issue, but (God bless you, Helen Darling) this will be a wonderful gathering. I hope to see you there.

Of course, not everyone celebrates Christmas. We do appreciate our members with different beliefs, and I've gotten some nice comments from non-Christian members who appreciate this sensitivity. However, today I'm thinking of some Christians who don't celebrate Christmas...or who can't celebrate it easily. The Friday before Christmas, I headed down to Philly for the wake of a 66-year old character I knew from 20 years of Irish Caribbean cruises and festivals. The next day, one of my college classmates lost his battle with melanoma. (I remember playing his wedding at the Manhattan College chapel; it actually started on time.) I doubt these families will be belting out Joy to the World—not this year—but they will be in church, and they need the most beautiful music we can give them.

I don't think this is unique to Christmas. It happens every week, and not always for sad reasons. Many years ago, a tenor in my choir came to Palm Sunday Mass straight from the hospital where his wife delivered their first child. The reading of the Passion of Our Lord was the furthest thing from his mind that morning, but he needed to be in church, thanking God for the gift of his daughter. He needed to make the most beautiful music he could, and he did.

I'm thinking also of a colleague who's retiring; Christmas Eve will be her last service in a church she served faithfully for many years. (The current minister is not a fan of traditional music; they may not even use the organ after she retires.) She needs to make the most beautiful music she can (and she will).

We do not always know who comes to church or temple with sorrows or joys that don't fit neatly into the "official" celebration of the day, but I think we know who needs the most beautiful music we can give, and that's everyone: our clergy, our choir members, our congregations, and ourselves. May this New Year 2014 be our best yet!
