So I was delighted when I turned to page 22 of the March issue of TAO, and saw a nice little article about St. Luke's in Eastchester honoring our Susan LaFever for 10 years of service. There was a nice picture, too. It's good to be reminded that there are clergy and churches that appreciate good musicians and good music, and we certainly appreciate them!

I'm really looking forward to our March 30 meeting. It's a *very* practical session, a sight singing workshop with Liz Fleischer, at Reformed Church of the Tarrytowns, at 4:30. Bring your choir members, your cantors, your soloists—and if you know any colleagues who don't belong to the chapter, invite them to come along and discover what the AGO offers all of us.

Finally, Lois Simmonds will be stepping down as Co-editor of *The Trompette* after this issue. Lois has been responsible for getting the hard copies printed and mailed to those of you who don't receive it by e-mail. We thank her for her years of service, and we thank Alice Avouris assuming this additional duty.
