Greetings from the Dean.... Dear Colleagues,

Most of you will see this before our March 30 meeting, so let me start off with a gentle plug for that. It's a *very* practical session, a sight singing workshop with Liz Fleischer, at Reformed Church of the Tarrytowns, at **4:30**—that's half an hour later than our usual time. Bring your choir members, your cantors, your soloists—and if you know any colleagues who don't belong to the chapter, invite them to come along and discover what the AGO offers all of us.

You don't have to be a Christian to belong to the AGO...but the nature of the guild is that most of us work in Christian churches, and with Easter falling on April 20, an April meeting just isn't practical. So our next meeting will be in May. Originally, we planned for an organ crawl in Pelham, but we ran into some unexpected problems on that. (Long story; if you want details, catch me after the next meeting.) However, God never closes one door without opening another, and we are thrilled that organist/composer David Hurd will present a workshop on his hymn tune improvisations at Huguenot Church in Pelham (which would have been the last stop on the crawl) on May 18 at 4:00. More details in next month's issue, but please plan on joining us for what should be a fascinating afternoon (and, again, feel free to bring a colleague who doesn't yet belong to the chapter).

Elsewhere in this issue you will find the Nominating Committee's report. I'd like to thank them for their work in coming up with the slate of candidates, and I'd like to thank those who accepted the invitation to appear on the ballot, and their willingness to serve our chapter. But there are lots of ways of serving the chapter. Right now, we could use someone to take on the role of Placement Director. I've been wearing that hat as well as Dean since Jayson had to relocate for family reasons, but it would be best if someone else could take that on. It involves keeping the sub list current, notifying subs of requests we get from churches or organists, as well as notifying the newsletter editor of permanent positions that become available. We learn about most of those by e-mail, but sometimes we find out about them from the AGO's national site, or from ChoralNet. You MUST have internet access (you can access placement@agowestchester.org from the internet, or you access it using Outlook or some other e-mail program). If you think this is a way you'd like to serve, send me an e-mail.

To those of you who are busy preparing for Holy Week and Easter services, may your music be a blessing to your congregations, your choirs, and to you. To all of you, I wish you a nice, warm, sunny spring—and, for what it's worth, News12 says it will be 61 and sunny for our March 30 meeting. I sure hope they're right!

Celebration of the His Lifetime Achievements Will Benefit the AGO Endowment Fund

NEW YORK CITY — The American Guild of Organists (AGO) will sponsor a Recital and Gala Benefit Reception honoring award-winning organist and composer Charles Callahan on Friday, April 25, 2014, at 7:00 p.m., at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis in St. Louis, Mo. Mr. Callahan will perform a solo recital featuring works by American composers. The gala benefit reception will follow at the Chase Park Plaza Hotel.

The Recital is free and open to the public. Gala Benefit Reception Tickets are \$125 (\$100 tax deductible) and can be purchased online at www.agohq.org or by calling 212-870-2311, ext. 4308. Gala ticket holders will be offered preferred seating and will have their names printed in the commemorative program book. The deadline to be included is April 1.

CHARLES CALLAHAN

A native of Cambridge, Mass., Charles Callahan is well known as an award-winning composer, organist, pianist, and teacher. Callahan's compositions are performed frequently in church and concert; his writing style has been described by The Washington Post as "gentle, confident lyricism."

Dr. Callahan is a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music and the Catholic University of America, with additional study in England, France, Germany, and Belgium. He holds the AGO's Associateship and Choirmaster certificates.

Among his notable compositions are two commissions from Harvard University and commissions from the Archdioceses of St. Louis and New York for Papal visits, scored for full orchestra, choir, and congregation. His *Mosaics*, a symphonic work in four movements for organ and orchestra, was premiered at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis.

Dr. Callahan is frequently consulted on the design of new organs and the restoration of and improvements to existing instruments. His two volumes on American organ building history, *The American Classic Organ* and *AEolian-Skinner Remembered*, have become standard reference works.

An active church musician and concert organist, Charles Callahan has performed on many of the
great organs of the world and has a dozen solo recordings to his credit. A member of the American
Guild of Organists and the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, he lives in rural

St. John's Episcopal Church is in search of a dynamic, imaginative and resourceful Music Director who will strive to inspire the musical life of the Parish, and lead music in two distinct Worship Services each Sunday. The successful candidate will possess a genuine desire to teach with kindness, lead with confidence and inspire the church community. The Music Director will be charged with the critical task of creating from the ground up a fully graded music program.

Our Family Worship Service requires someone with a sincere aspiration to embrace and cultivate the young student instrumentalists and singers in our Parish community. Must possess electronic keyboard skills and have an ability to work in a diverse mix of Sacred Music.
