Job Description: Christ Church, an Episcopal congregation in Manhasset, New York, seeks a part-time Organist and Choirmaster to lead and further nurture our music program.

The Organist and Choirmaster will report directly to the Rector of the Parish, and will be expected to collaborate extensively with the Rector in the planning and execution of a music program that is fully supportive of the parish's worship life. This task includes maintaining our strong tradition of Anglican sacred music, while also embracing the opportunity to introduce new and diverse musical offerings as circumstances allow.

Candidates for this position must demonstrate an ability to have a fruitful and collaborative relationship with both the Rector, Choir, and members of the congregation at large.

The Christ Church Chancel Choir is anchored around four paid section leaders (one in each voice), with the remainder of the membership coming from enthusiastic volunteers drawn from the parish and surrounding community. At present, a Choral Scholars program encourages the development of musical and vocal talent in high school youth with a scholarship offered to further their education at the end of their senior year. The organ at Christ Church is a three manual, fifty-nine rank organ built by Casavant Frères (Opus 3122) in 1971. The parish will undertake the renovation or replacement of the organ in the next several years.

Job Requirements. Required Skills and Abilities

Strong communication skills and an ability to interact well with the entire spectrum of a church community: children, youth and their parents; paid and volunteer choir members; parish clergy and lay leadership; and parishioners and parish staff.

Demonstrated ability to collaborate in the planning of sacred music in worship, and a willingness and ability to accept supervision from the Rector in setting the proper tone and vision for music in the liturgy.

Ability to be a "self-starter," and willingness to offer new ideas for the growth of the music program at Christ Church.

Excellent organizational and administrative skills.

Proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite, Adobe Acrobat, and either Sibelius or Finale.

Core Responsibilities

Plan, lead, and accompany all organ, choral, and other music at the principal services of the church, including, but not limited to:

Choral Eucharist, Sundays at 10:00 am

Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, and Christmas Eve Services

Choral Evensong and/or Lessons & Carols, as the program may develop.

Pastoral Liturgies such as Weddings & Funerals (for which additional compensation is provided)

Plan, lead, and accompany all choir rehearsals. (At present, one Thursday night rehearsal for the Chancel Choir and Schola Cantorum, plus a warm-up rehearsal prior to the Sunday 10:00 am Choral Eucharist.)

Plan the music rota of hymnody, psalmody, and choral pieces for the liturgical year in close consultation with the Rector.

Manage the hiring of professional musicians, as appropriate and within the parameters of the parish's budget, for liturgical celebrations and special services, including the recruiting and management of paid members of the Choir. This responsibility also includes the securing of substitute musicians during the Organist and Choirmaster's absence.

Keep appropriate records for the Schola Cantorum, and arrange for the payment of scholarship accrued by its members upon their graduation from high school.

Serve as chief recruiter for the Christ Church Chancel Choir, Schola Cantorum, and Children's Choir, inviting parishioners and non-parishioners alike to offer their gifts to the music ministries of the church.

Direct the musical training of children within the Children's Choir, as appropriate to their abilities. The Children's Choir, while small, is enthusiastic, and ideally performs several times a year. The key emphasis in the Children's Choir is to teach children new musical skills in a nurturing, supportive, and fun environment.

Serve as the chief musical teacher not only to the choir, but to the congregation, including teaching and leading occasional public forums, writing articles for the parish newsletter.

Manage and oversee the music library, including managing the payment of licensing fees for reprint permissions and reporting of reprint usage, and the purchase of new music as budget permits.

Arrange for the maintenance and tuning of the Casavant organ so that it is in an appropriate state of readiness for the church's worship. This task will include long-term planning for the refurbishment or replacement of the organ in the near future.

As a member of the parish staff, attend and participate in Parish Staff meetings, which will be scheduled on at least a monthly basis. Attend and report to Parish Vestry meetings as requested.

All finalists for the position will be expected to undergo a background check, and upon hiring, will be expected to participate in required Diocesan Safe Church training, or provide evidence of its recent completion. The finalist hired will be expected to participate in quarterly Mutual Ministry Reviews with the Rector over the first year of employment, and annual reviews every year thereafter.

Christ Church is accessible via public transit, and is a short walk from the Long Island Rail Road's Manhasset station on the Port Washington line.

Compensation is in line with AGO Standards for a Part Time Position, and Benefits are Negotiable.

Job Description Overview: This position is part of a ministry team whose members work together in coordination and cooperation to meet the worship needs of this congregation. Each Sunday morning has one worship service requiring the preparation and playing of a minimum of seven pieces, including hymns. Since each piece has the potential of ministering to the congregation in a special, unique way, all of which contributes to the whole, music needs to be selected that complements the service.

General responsibilities include: service playing, accompanying the Chancel Choir and other choirs as needed, playing special services, weddings and funerals, rehearsing with musicians (vocal and instrumental) when required, choosing music and practicing.

Special Responsibilities:

Scheduled events: Sunday Services

Chancel Choir rehearsals

Choir retreats (One Saturday, Fall and Winter)

Christmas Eve Services Maundy Thursday Good Friday Ash Wednesday

If there are any services beyond this, the organist will be compensated at \$200 per service.

Other Information: The organist will receive one month of vacation. It alternates between July and August, dependent upon the summer schedule of services. With advanced notice, the organist may also be granted release time for a total of two additional Sunday services with the substitute being paid by the church. This will be granted at the discretion of the senior pastor and the director of music. The original intent for these two Sundays was to give time to the organist following the heaviest stress times in the church year, Christmas and Easter.

For any such occurrence, Sunday absence due to illness will be handled at the discretion of the senior pastor, director of music and organist. The church will potentially pay for one Sunday in the year for illness. The organist will be permitted to use the church facilities (organ and piano) for private teaching. Times of lessons and use of facilities must be scheduled in advance through the church office so as not to conflict with the church program needs. The organist needs to be flexible if some kind of emergency scheduling conflict arises. Students who use the church organ or grand piano for additional practice time are expected to pay an additional fee to the church.

The organist will inform the director of music of any organ or piano maintenance needs.

The organist is encouraged to continue their studies which could include attending workshops, taking lessons, or reading/evaluating music of new composers.

Upon reasonable notice, the organist shall attend scheduled meetings of the Music Committee.

Job evaluations are done yearly, usually in the summer or early fall, at the start of the church program year. The organist will be evaluated by the director of music and the senior pastor.
