Dedication of the New HUGUENOT MEMORIAL CHURCH Organ Pelham, New York

Saturday April 9 Dedicatory Recital by Jan-Piet Kniff at 8 PM and Sunday, April 10, 2016 in the afternoon a workshop for young pianists and their teachers

The venerable Dutch firm Adema (at 160 years, the oldest Dutch organ building firm, and still specializing in Romantic-style organs) recently placed an organ in Huguenot Memorial Church, 901 Pelhamdale Ave., Pelham NY. The instrument, which boasts 44 stops on three manuals and pedal, combines two historic British organs, one by Ingram 1875, another by Hele-Willis (1900/1950), supplemented by other Willis stops as well as by two stops from the church's former Aeolian-Skinner.

Jan-Piet Kniff, who acted as the church's consultant and guided the church in choosing the organ building firm, will be giving the dedicatory recital on **April 9th**, **2016 at 8:00 p.m.**, followed by a reception. All are invited to attend and there is no charge. **On Sunday April 10th**, **from 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.**, Dr. Knijff will give a workshop for piano students and their teachers also free of charge. Anybody interested in trying out the new organ is welcome. Those who would like to learn a "real" organ piece in advance may contact Dr. Knijff for repertoire suggestions. Loyola School students strive to become young men and women who are open to growth, academically excellent, religious, loving, and committed to doing justice. Loyola School is committed to challenging its students religiously, intellectually, physically, and socially.

Position Summary: The needs of Loyola with regard to its music program are somewhat diverse in nature, due to the small size of the school and the scope of the music program. The needs of Loyola for a full-time music teacher would be someone who would bring expertise to each of the following areas:

Academic Music Program: The Music Teacher will teach a Freshman Music History & Theory course as well as Junior and Senior Music Theory Electives (depending on enrollment). The Music Teacher will also have mentor and other faculty responsibilities.

Extracurricular Music Program: The Music Teacher will oversee the Loyola Orchestra and Instrumental Ensembles, as well as the Loyola Chorus and A Capella Group. These activities are given time during the

school day, and are considered part of the extracurricular offerings of the school. The rehearsals for these activities occur before and after school, as well as during the academic schedule. These groups perform at the annual Christmas Concert and Spring Concert.

Liturgical Music Program: The full-time Director of Music at Loyola should have the background and ability to oversee the music for school liturgies in collaboration with the Campus Minister. This would include selecting the music, preparing the cantors, practicing the music with the liturgical music singers and musicians, and leading the group during the liturgies.

Musical Direction for the Loyola Players: The full-time Director of Music should have the background and ability to perform duties as the musical director of a theatrical musical. (Although Loyola will probably not perform a musical every year, the Moderator of Dramatics and the Director of Music would consult with regard to the available talent in any given year to determine the feasibility of a musical theatre offering. It would be a goal to have a musical at least every other year.) The musical director should have the ability to teach the vocal music to the cast and rehearse it with them. Ideally, the musical director should be able to accompany the cast on piano. The musical director would also teach the music to the orchestra and rehearse it with them.

Integration of the various parts of the program would be discussed between the Principal and the Director of Music.

In the tradition of the Jesuit spirit of *cura personalis* (care and concern for the whole person), Loyola's teachers are also expected to participate as coaches and moderators of teams and activities and to be engaged in the life of the school outside of the classroom; ability to contribute to the extracurricular and spiritual life of the school is required.
