

Alexander Pattavina, CAGO, is a second year undergraduate student at The Juilliard School, pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Organ Performance as a student of Grammy-winning organist, Paul Jacobs. He currently serves as the Organ Scholar at Christ Church, Bronxville. Alex began his organ studies at what is now St. Paul's Choir School with John Dunn, continuing shortly after with Philip Jones of Brockton, MA. Alex is a native of Stoughton, MA. He has held positions as Organ Scholar at St. Michael's Episcopal Church in NYC, St. Paul's Church, Harvard Square and Assistant Organist of St. Joseph's Church in Needham, MA. During his time at St. Paul's, Alex accompanied the Parish Choir in its performances of Britten's "Rejoice in the Lamb" and Vaughan Williams' "Five Mystical Songs". Alex earned his SPC and CAGO professional Certifications from the American Guild of Organists. He has competed in several organ competitions, receiving First Prize in the 2014 L. Cameron Johnson Memorial Competition in Storrs, CT and Second Prize in the 2014 Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival in Wethersfield, CT. Additionally, Alex has studied organ improvisation with Peter Krasinski and Bruce Neswick, both previous winners of AGO improvisation competitions.
